277. What are the Stations of the Cross?

Following Jesus on his Way of the Cross by praying and meditating on the fourteen Stations is a very ancient devotion in the Church, which is practiced especially in Lent and Holy week. [1674 - 1675]

The fourteen Stations of the Cross are:

1. Jesus is condemned to death.
2. Jesus takes up his Cross.
3. Jesus falls the first time.
4. Jesus meets his sorrowful Mother.
5. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry the Cross.
6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
7. Jesus falls the second time.
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.
9. Jesus falls the third time.
10. Jesus is striped of his garments.
11. Jesus is nailed to the Cross.
12. Jesus dies on the Cross.
13. Jesus is taken down from the Cross and presented to his sorrowful Mother.
14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.

278. What is the purpose of a Christian funeral?

A Christian funeral is a service performed by the Christian community for the benefit of its dead. It expresses the sorrow of the survivors, yet it always has a Paschal character. Ultimately, we die in Christ so as to celebrate with him the feast of the Resurrection. [1686 - 1690]

**Family
of Faith Campaign**

The Family of Faith Campaign is an unprecedented effort being undertaken by the Archdiocese of Toronto and its 225 parishes and is based on the pastoral plan for our Archdiocese. The money raised by the campaign will go towards Parish based Youth Ministry, Campus and Young Adult Ministry, Communicating our Faith, Catholic Formation and Leadership Development, Parish Life and local Projects, St. Michael's Cathedral renovation, building of new parish churches and capital improvements to existing Churches.

The overall goal of the campaign is \$105 million and our parish goal is set at \$300,000 in non-binding pledges over 3-5 years. Upon reaching our goal, a minimum of 25 percent of the funds we raise will be returned to us for our own needs. Upon surpassing our goal, we will receive 75 percent of all over goal funds raised!

The good news is that to date, we have raised \$295,281 or 98 percent of our goal. With just two weeks to end our campaign, we are hoping to reach our goal.

With the funds returned to our parish, we plan to meet the following priority needs:

- We will establish an endowment fund that will help subsidized the tuition and fees for prospective University students from our parish
- We will erect a life-sized statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in front of the Church.

Each and every parish family is invited to contribute to the success of this initiative in a way appropriate to them . It will take many parish families to make these dreams a reality for the future. Our parish goal is achievable with your support!
