The Dignity of the Human Person

307. What is faith?

Faith is the power by which we assent to God, acknowledge his truth, and commit ourselves personally to him. [1814 - 1816, 1842]

Faith is the path created by God leading to the truth that is God himself. Because Jesus is "the way, and the truth, and the life" (Jn 14:6), this faith cannot be merely an attitude or "confidence" about something or other. On the one hand, the faith has definite contents, which the Church professes in the Creed (= profession of faith), and it is her duty to safeguard them. Anyone who wants to accept the gift of faith, in other words, anyone who wants to believe, acknowledges this faith, which has been preserved constantly through the ages and in many different cultures. On the other hand, part of faith is a trusting relationship to God with heart and mind, with all one's emotional strength. For faith becomes effective only through charity, practical love (see Gal 5:6). Whether someone really believes in the God of love is shown, not in his solemn affirmations, rather in charitable deeds.

308. What is hope?

Hope is the power by which we firmly and constantly long for what we were placed on earth to do: to praise God and to serve him; and for our true happiness, which is finding our fulfillment in God; and for our final home: in God. [1817 - 1821, 1843]

Hope is trusting in what God has promised us in creation, in the prophets, but especially in Jesus Christ, even though we do not yet see it. God's Holy Spirit is given to us so that we can patiently hope for the Truth. 1 - 3

Only good things come from God's hands. He never gives you more than you can bear. Every burden prepares you for eternity. (Mg)

SAY "MERRY CHRISTMAS AND NOT "HAPPY HOLIDAYS!"

On December 23, 2011, Lorrie Goldstein wrote the following in the Sun newspaper:

Being Jewish never interfered with my enjoyment of Christmas or my love for this time of the year

Indeed, I cannot remember one time growing up - or any incident to this day - where I found anything about the Christmas season to be offensive, or to interfere with my own celebration of the Jewish holiday of Hanukkah, at this time of the year......

I've never understood busy-body bureaucrats and officious officials who want to ban the symbols of Christmas at this time of year for the sake of not offending "religious minorities."

Um! Which religious minorities? Be specific and don't presume to speak for me and all sorts of other folks who are not Christians.

You know, for a member of a religious minority like myself, Canada is a pretty cool place. It provided a safe haven to my late father and his family after they were smuggled out of Russia in the early 20th Century during an anti-Semitic pogrom, which, trust me on this, were a lot more dangerous to Jews than Christmas trees or carols.

Indeed, as one of the relatively few countries on Earth that guarantees religious freedom and uses the power of the state to protect minorities from religious persecution, Canada is alright by me.

And Christmas is a part of Canada.

So Merry Christmas and Happy Hanukkah, everyone.
