332. How is solidarity of Christians with other people expressed? Christians are committed to just societal structures. Part of this is universal access to the material, intellectual, and spiritual goods of this world. Christians also make sure that the dignity of human work is respected, which includes a just wage. Handing on the faith is also an act of solidarity with all mankind. [1939 - 1942, 1948]

Solidarity is the practical hallmark of a Christian. Practicing solidarity is not just a command of reason. Jesus Christ, our Lord, identified completely with the poor and the lowly (Mt 25:40). To refuse solidarity with them would be to reject Christ.

333. Is there a natural law that everyone can know?

If people are to do good and avoid evil, certainly about what is good or evil must be inscribed within them. In fact there is such a moral law that is, so to speak, "natural" to men and can be known in principle by every person by reason. [1949 - 1960, 1975, 1978 - 1979]

The natural moral law is valid for everyone. It tells men what fundamental rights and duties they have and thus forms the real foundation for life together in the family, in society, and in the State. Because our natural knowledge is often troubled by sin and human weakness, a person needs God's help and his Revelation in order to stay on the right path.

334. What connection is there between the "natural moral law" and the Law of the Old Covenant?

The Law of the Old Covenant expresses truths that by nature are evident to human reason yet are now proclaimed and authenticated as God's Law. [1961 - 1963, 1981]

Basing his reflections on an extract from St. Paul's letter to the Hebrews, the Pope said our God forgives all our sins, always and without exception and He rejoices when somebody asks him for pardon. This God who pardons us, he continued, chose Jesus to set up a new pact with humanity and the cornerstone of this pact is forgiveness for our sins.

"First of all, God always forgives us. He never tires of this. It's we who get tired of asking for forgiveness. But HE does not tire of pardoning us. When Peter asked Jesus: 'How many times must I forgive? Seven times?' - 'Not seven times: seventy times by seven'. Namely always. That's how God forgives us: always. But if you have lived a life full of so many sins, so many bad things, but in the end, a bit repentant, you ask for forgiveness, He will immediately pardon you! He always pardon us."
