82. Why are people afraid of becoming incapacitated?

There is a concern about being at the mercy of others. People fear dependency or loneliness. The legitimate hospice movement addresses all these concerns. Precisely in the final phase of life, we must give the dying the opportunity to approach their own death with the loving care of other people. In addition to that, they especially need spiritual assistance in the last weeks and days of their life.

83. What is the significance of dying from the Christian perspective?

Today dying often appears to be nothing more than bodily deterioration. Dying however, is a decisive part of life, and for many people - the step to final maturity. For a Christian, life is a gift. This thought inspires trust even in one's difficult last hours. We know that we are in the hand of a loving God and have hope that death is not the end but a transition to eternal life. This puts the experience of suffering into a completely different perspective. Again and again those in the pastoral ministry find that this hope gives consolation even to seemingly irreligious people who are facing their actual death. In the suffering and dying person, Christ is especially close to us.
