84. What are the principles of Catholic social teachings?

Catholic social teaching has four principles:

- the principle of the dignity of the human person (personhood)
- the principle of the common good
- the principle of subsidiarity and
- the principle of solidarity.

With these four principles, we can grasp human society in its entirely and consider this reality truthfully. Why do these principles apply? They apply, in the first place, because they are reasonable. And they apply, secondly, because they result from the Christian faith, which illuminates by reason. Someone who believes wants to obey God's commandments, especially the Greatest Commandment of Love of God and Neighbour. Nowadays Christians are confronted with various societal problems. Whether it is a question of relations between individuals, groups, or nations - in every case, with the help of the four principles of Catholic social teaching, we can tell what is truly human, socially beneficial, and just.
