The Common Good, Personhood, Solidarity, Subsidiarity The Principles of the Church's Social Teaching

96. Does the principle of subsidiarity apply to politics as well?

Yes. Applying the principle of subsidiarity is indispensable when it is a question, for instance, of determining the relation of local governments to the federal government. Only in cases where a local government cannot resolve a problem by itself may the federal government claim competence. In principle, however, there can be situations in which a higher level must intervene: when, for example, there is a sufficiently large natural disaster or when human rights are violated.

97. What does the principle of subsidiarity mean for the individual?

We cannot just leave questions about living together to "the higher-ups". In our situation we must take the initiative in addressing problems and ask for help from the next-higher level only if we are over-burdened. Before one does that, of course, person-to-person assistance is appropriate, both for those who offer and for those who receive help. As a matter of principle, a Christian is called to participate actively in society and to exclude no one.
