98. How can there be shared responsibility without harmful dependency?

Through participation. The participation of citizens is a cornerstone of democracy and therefore important for Christians, also. Christians show solidarity by seeking to participate in civil society and influence its fate. In this way they look after their responsibility to shape the world. The possibility of participating must be guaranteed to all citizens in order to bring about socalled participatory justice (see below).

99. What can participation look like in practice?

Important prerequisites for appropriate participation are a sound education and information. Participation must be in the proper measure and must not be misused to promote merely personal interests. Nor should it consist solely of exercising the right to vote (GS 30-31; CA 51-52). In this regard, the Church's social doctrine especially criticizes authoritarian regimes that see any participation of citizens as a threat. Above and beyond the right to vote, social involvement is demanded of Christians, regardless of whether this involvement is in the parish, a political party, or a neighbourhood association. Lay people especially should require special competence in many societal issues and thus collaborate in shaping the local community (GS 43). Of course, as a Christian one should not just become involved in society personally but should also, in solidarity, make it possible for others to participate. The real participation of all is the care of participatory justice, which in turn is a decisive element of social justice in general. The exclusion of individuals denies their dignity and thus violates the command to respect the human person.
