#### THE FAMILY

#### 112. Why does God want us to live together in families?

God would not want every person to live alone; he created us as social beings. Human persons, therefore, are by nature designed for communion (in the family). This is clear on the very first pages of the Bible in the creation account: God places Eve at Adam's side to be his partner. "The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper fit for him. So the Lord God ... took one of his ribs ... and made (it) into a woman and brought her to the man. Then the man said, 'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh.'" (Gen 2:20-23)

#### 113. What significance does the family have in the Bible?

The Bible often deals with family life: in the Old Testament parents are required to hand on to their children experiences of God's love and fidelity and to impart to them the first and most important wisdom in life. The new testament records that Jesus, too, was born into a specific family. His parents showed him affection and love and raised him. The fact that God looked for a completely "normal" family in which to be born as man and to grow up made the family a special place of God and gave it a unique value as a community.

#### 114. How does the Church see the family?

The Church regards the family as the first and most important natural community. The family has special rights and is central to all social life. After all, it is the place where human life comes into being and the place where the first interpersonal relationships develop. The family is the foundation of society; all social arrangements proceed from it. On account of this great significance, the Church sees the family as divinely instituted.
