THE FAMILY

121. What role did the elderly play in the family?

The presence of older people living in the family can prove to be very valuable. They are the example of the ties between the generations, and thanks to their wealth of experience they can make a decisive contribution toward the well-being of the family and of society as a whole. They can transmit values and traditions and support the young. In this way the latter learn not only to care about themselves but to look after others, also. When elderly persons are sick and needy, they need not only medical attention and appropriate care but above all loving treatment and surroundings.

122. Why do children need special protection?

Children have to be strengthened and depended in every way. "A child is God's greatest gift to the family, to the nation, to the world" (Mother Teresa). Children are the future of humanity. They are naturally in need of help. Moreover, they often grow up in atrocious conditions. In many parts of the world there is a lack of medical care, appropriate nutrition, elementary education, or even a place to live. Moreover, there are ongoing scandals such as trafficking in children, child labor, the phenomenon of "street children", the deployments of children in wars, the marriage of children, and the (sexual) abuse of children. There must be a decisive campaign on the national and international level against violations of the dignity of boys and girls that occur through sexual exploitation and all forms of violence and in favor of respect for the dignity and rights of every child.
