129. If a couple is able to have children, how many should they have?

Married couples should accept the children that are sent to them by God. That does not mean, however, that every married couple should thoughtlessly have (many) children. Instead - in conformity with the Church's authoritative teaching - the married couple should make their decision for motherhood and fatherhood responsibly, taking into account their health and their economic, spiritual, and social situation. In this they must learn to understand the language of their bodies, making use of methods of natural family planning. Decisions about the interval between births and the number of children are up to the married couple alone, to be made prayerfully and with correctly formed consciences. This is their inalienable right, which they exercise in the sight of God and taking into consideration their duties toward themselves, any children who may already be born, their family, and society.

130. May governmental family policies try to influence couples' decisions?

Yes. Family Policy certainly may encourage couples to be thoughtful about the number of children they have, in the light of the needs of society and the common good. In any case, this must be done with respect for human persons and for the couples' freedom. The policy may - and even should - provide information about the demographic situation, and it can issue regulations that, for example, create economic and other advantages for families with children. Thereby it can create incentives, but ultimately the decision about the number of their children must be left to the couples themselves. No one may deprive them of this freedom of decision.
