131. Why should the State and society do anything for the family?

The family, by its very nature, makes important contribution to society that often go quite unnoticed and unappreciated. The obligation of society and the State to do something for families, too, follows from the fact that the family is the smallest, indispensable unit of society. This is where governmental family policy begins. A nation necessarily depends on potential parents to decide to have children; the State, however, can in no way coerce this decision; it must be made with complete freedom by the citizens. The State thus places its own future in the hands of its citizens, who are entitled to freedom. Again and again surveys show that citizens in principle value the family very highly. Governmental family policy tries to make it possible for them to decide to start a family in the present societal and political conditions, by shaping economic conditions accordingly.

132. What can the State and society do for the families? First, it is important for both society and the State to acknowledge the family as something special and central and therefore to protect and support its unique character. This starts with strengthening the home life of the family, but it also includes respect for human life in every phase, especially for the unborn. When we talk about the State protecting and supporting the family, this can never mean that society or the State, for economic or ideological reasons, take over or even takes away duties originally belonging to the family and thus narrows its social dimension; instead, the goal of family policy measures, in keeping with the principles of subsidiarity, must be to enable families to perform their own tasks suitability.

133. What is meant specifically by "family policy in keeping with the principle of subsidiarity"?

An example: In keeping with the principle of subsidiarity, it cannot be the State's task to raise children, because that would take away from parents a task that has belonged to them from the beginning. Rather, in the given circumstances (living conditions, work, and educational opportunities), the State should give families all the necessary assistance. Here it is important to preserve real freedom of choice, for instance, with regard to parental cooperation in dividing up the work of caring for the family and earning a living. The special function of the family in communicating knowledge and the formation of the children can be replaced neither through day care and schools nor through other societal groups, although these institutions can help to support and supplement parental education. The principle of subsidiarity emphasizes at the same time the autonomy of every person and of families. This means that families themselves can and should become involved in political and societal institutions and also join together to stand up for their rights and to strengthen them.
