HUMAN WORK

142. What is the difference between the Church's social teaching and Marxism?

Karl Marx (1818-1883) also developed his Communist doctrine as a reaction to the worker question. For him, however, the answer was an inevitable class struggle between the proletariat and the bourgeoisie. The bourgeoisie had to be violently dispossessed, and a dictatorship of the proletariat was to be set up. In the twentieth century, the Communist ideology brought unimaginable suffering upon mankind. From the very beginning, The Church recognized the dangers of Communism and harshly condemned the teaching of class warfare. The Church's social doctrine and the Christian Social Democratic Movement in Europe have been committed instead to a just balancing of interest among the various participants in the economy and society.

143. What is the difference between the "objective" and the "subjective" dimension of work?

Economists speak about the labor productivity of a business or even of an individual. The Church's social teaching distinguishes this "objective" dimension of work from the "subjective" dimension of work. The latter is the dignity that is inherent in all work, because it is accomplished by a human being. Pope John Paul II describes this view of man with his inalienable dignity as the subject of work as "the fundamental and perennial heart of Christian teaching on human work" (LE 6). Therefore, we must never treat arrogantly those who do supposedly "menial" jobs, for which one needs no special training or particular qualifications.

Today we hail Christ as our King. He is the Victor over the power of death Who loves us and freed us from our sins by His own blood, and Who by Baptism has made us a royal nation of priests in the service of His Father and our God. He Who is King continues to choose men and women to serve as priests, sisters, brothers or deacons, so that the faithful may know Him, love Him and serve Him as well.
