151. What does the Church's social teaching say about the issue of child labor?

In the early phase of industrialization, the exploitation of children through child labor was one of the great scandals in America and Europe. Even today child labor is widespread in the emerging and developing nations. Often sheer economic deprivation is what forces families to put their children to work for wages. The goal, therefore, must be to create social conditions throughout the world that offer all families a secure means of livelihood without any need for children to contribute to the family income. Under no circumstances should child labor be tolerated if it harms the children's intellectual and physical development. The exploitation and enslavement of children is an injustice that cries out to heaven.

152. How do we deal fairly with the phenomenon of migrant workers?

In today's world there are great imbalances between poor and rich countries and regions. Therefore, many people today leave their homes to find jobs and wages in densely populated areas or in other countries. These people are called migrant workers. If a country decides to welcome migrant workers, then they must not be treated as second-class laborers. In no case may migrant workers be exploited; in their work they must have the same rights and receive the same wages as the local employees. Moreover, they must be respected as a human beings who are not just laborers. In particular, the right of migrant workers to bring their families after them must be respected. The State, the business community, and society are obliged to make efforts to integrate migrant workers into society comprehensively.
