153. How does social teaching react to the upheavals in agriculture worldwide?

More than other branches of the economy, agriculture makes a distinctive mark on the landscape and culture of a society. Therefore, the preservation of viable farming industry is important even for the highly developed industrial nations. In most countries of the world, however, the agrarian sector is now as always the most important sector of the economy by far. Most of the people work in it, too. This is true particularly of the poor countries and regions of the world. Often the basic problem is that the farm lands is in the hands of a few major landowners. Where such landownership leads to the exploitation of the rural population, is detrimental to the common good, and stands in the way of a positive development of the national economy, the Church's social teaching calls for agrarian reform and a new distribution of land. Such steps must be taken in an orderly, legal way. Old injustice must not be fought with new injustice.

154. Why must there be special laws concerning labor and employment?

In a market economy, there is a real balance between the two partners to a contract (and thus room to negotiate the terms of the contract) only if both sides have the same information and the same economic strength. In a labor contract that is usually not the case. As a rule, the employer is the better informed and economically superior party. This is why the legitimate interests of the employees must be protected by special laws, collectively referred to as the labor law. These include, for example, protection from wage exploitation, the right to have Sundays and vacation time off, and entitlement to support in the event of unemployment or illness; protection for mothers was already mentioned earlier.
