169. What shall I do about other people's poverty?

Because God loves every individual human being "unto death on the cross", Christians look at their fellowmen in a new light. Even in the poorest of the poor they recognize Christ, their Lord. Christians are therefore deeply motivated to do everything possible to alleviate the sufferings of others. In doing so they take as their guide the **Works of Mercy.** One can help person-to-person. But it is also possible, through donations, indi rectly to help poor people to survive and to live in dignity. Much more important, however, is assistance that enables the poor person to free himself from poverty, for example, by finding him a job or giving him a better education. In doing so, no one should feel overburdened, but no one should feel too easily exempt. Businessmen make an important contribution toward the fight against poverty by creating jobs and humane working conditions.

170. Can we bring about "the Kingdom of God" through material progress?

If we work passionately and perseveringly for comprehensive human development and to preserve the environment, we can accomplish much but not remake paradise. Jesus says: "My kingship is not of this world" (Jn 18:36). The kingdom of God therefore must not be confused with material or earthly progress. Nevertheless, to the extent that economic progress "can contribute to the better ordering of human society, it is of vital concern to the Kingdom of God" (GS 39).
