179. What are the limits of the free market?

Many people have no access at all to the market and cannot satisfy their fundamental needs. They are poor, have nothing to offer, and cannot buy anything. Again and again we must make it clear that a human being not only *has something* but above all is *someone* - one of our brothers or sisters who has an inalienable dignity. "It is a strict duty of justice and truth not to allow fundamental human needs to remain unsatisfied, and not to allow those burdened by such needs to perish" (John Paul II, CA 34). Moreover, the free market is limited by the fact that there are numerous goods that have no price and therefore cannot be sold: a human being himself (prostitution, exploitation, human trafficking), his health (the industrialization and commercialization of medicine), his body parts (the organ trade), or else friendship, forgiveness, family relationships, etc.

180. What does globalization mean for the economy?

Economically, the world is growing more and more interconnected. The fall of barriers after the end of the Cold War, the improvement of transportation, and especially the digital revolution have led to a situation in which businesses can communicate worldwide in real time and produce globally.
