186. Why is the economy a place and a school of humanity?

Many employees and employers work so much more than duty demands. They do this out of a sense of responsibility and out of love for their job and for the people who rely on the service they provide. Even employers do not always act in profit-oriented ways: investments are often an act of generosity, for investing means giving up immediate consumption and using funds to create jobs. Then, too, more and more people work in so-called non-profit organizations, which pursue social goals in an entrepreneurial spirit. Volunteering, too, is a form of work inspired by charity.

187. When does a business work successfully?

Success consists first but not exclusively in the efficient earning of profit. A business is good when it persistently creates something that is good for other people and for society. The State sets up the legal framework. It is not enough for a business to make donations from its profits; the important thing is to act justly, humanely, in a socially and environmentally conscious way already within the economic activity, at the heart of the business itself and its processes and goals.

188. How does one act justly in business?

In economic activity, one acts justly by giving the other his due. This consists chiefly in the faithful fulfillment of contracts, the honoring of agreements, the punctual and proper delivery of goods, and payment within the agreed time. In order to be just, contracts must be entered into freely, which means without deceit, fear, or coercion. Someone who as the more powerful negotiating partner forces on the other acts unjustly.
