189. What is a fair price?

Fundamentally, a fair price is what is agreed upon in free negotiations through the interaction of supply and demand. Many factors, however, can distort this free agreement: deception, a lack of information, a monopoly position of the seller or the buyer, an emergency situation affecting one of the partners, etc. Usury (the charging of excessive interest on a loan) and exploitation are sins against justice and charity.

190. What are the “sins” of business?

Unfortunately there is a lot of lying, trickery, swindling, and fraud in the business world. Those who act in this way destroy a firm’s real capital: trust. Without trust, the business cannot function: when someone gives his word or signs a contract, you must be able to rely on it. One gains trust through reliability and earns it through virtuous conduct. In the business world, one must guard especially against: greed, corruption, and any form of injustice, such as theft, fraud, usury, exploitation, etc.

191. The speculative financial market per se is a sinful structure, is it not?

No, not in principle. If they are oriented toward the common good, the financial market and the banks perform an important service: they make available the capital required for enterprises and businesses. The debtor must pay interest as the price for the liquidity that is offered. Moreover, the mechanism of speculation is good in itself, for it serves to equalize quantities and prices from one region to the next and to balance out times of shortage or surplus. Of course in recent years these instruments have been abused disastrously. The financial market is inflated. “Investors” have been speculating without anything of real value backing up their money. In a few seconds unimaginable sums are gained or lost, without any genuine work behind it.
