204. What does democracy owe to the ancient Greeks?

Much; the ancient Greeks invented the word itself (*demos* = people, *-kratos* = rule). Often, however, the origin of democracy is connected exclusively with Greek antiquity. Aside from the fact that only one-quarter of the population ("free" Greek men) had the right to vote, it was less highly esteemed than monarchy or aristocracy by almost all Greek philosophers and statesmen. The ideal was considered the "philosopher king", who could discern the political common good better than the "blind masses". The fundamental value of the human person did not yet define political thought.

205. Is democracy a result of Christianity?

To a great extent, yes. Only Christianity radically democratized something that in Greece had been reserved to a few and made it a fundamental element of human existence: the dignity of every person has, independently of his origins and his birth. Every individual stands in a direct relationship to God. This removes him from the reach of any political community that tries to make totalitarian claims on him. The dignity of every individual person is the real ethical foundation for the democratization of participation in political decision making. Moreover, modern democracy is based on human rights, which guarantee, for example, that human life will not be destroyed or minorities oppressed through arbitrary majority decisions.

206. Which is the ultimate authority: the State or the individual citizen?

Christianity has always emphasized that the ultimate binding authority is the conscience of the individual person. Immoral laws must not be obeyed, even if a State commands it. Democracy is not better than a monarchy or the aristocracy because it is more efficient but, rather, because it has a different ETHOS based on human rights and is a better organizational framework for the fulfillment of the human person.
