213. Are Christians not harming themselves when they defend the democratic system?

The democratic system is the system in which fundamental Christian principles are best preserved. In its political ethics, however, Christianity advocates no particular religious opinions but, rather, general governmental principles founded on right reason. "Whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, gracious, if there is any excellence [or] anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (cf. Phil 4:8). This is true also when Christians thereby get themselves into an apparently contradictory situation: On the one hand, they desire the most widespread acceptance of fundamental values, including freedom of religion and freedom of conscience. On the other hand, they put up with the fact that a majority may not think, act or make decisions according to those values. Christians can only patiently work to convince their fellow citizens to adopt other views.

214. What is the principle of laicity [radical secularism] mean?

The Church is critical of *Laicism/Secularism* because it seeks to exclude religion from public life. In contrast, the Church appreciates a cooperative form of secularism that carefully distinguishes between the proper responsibilities of Church and State, but strives for a positive cooperation for the good of men. Christians are obliged to support in a special way constitutional freedom, political participation, basic principles of the welfare state, freedom of conscience, and religious tolerance. Secularists repeatedly point out that in Europe democratic principles not infrequently had to gain acceptance against ecclesiastical and Christian resistance. But the principle of the dignity due each person, upon which modern democracy is rooted is the Christian view of man.
