215. What is the chief concern of political ethics?

"The human person is the foundation and purpose of political life" (Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church 384). This is the central theme of Christian political ethics. There are no political or ideological values for which human beings can be demoted to "means" by which to attain more valuable ends. In all totalitarian systems of the twentieth century, persons were sacrificed for ideologies. Even the principle of religion itself can be misused. Indeed, there are also religiously motivated ideologies and forms of terrorism, as we all know. The priority of the human person still must be defended again and again.

216. How does genuine authority function?

Without authority, any human community falls apart. Of course authority must not be arbitrary, it serves to direct people toward the common good in freedom. Nor should the common good consist of an arbitrary determination; rather, it must be something toward which all (should) be inclined out of reasonable self-interest because it is good for all. If this is the case, then Christians are obliged in conscience to obey the authority. All political authority exits on the basis of the dignity of the human conscience. Therefore, all politics that is guided by ethical principles makes the concept of conscience the central category of the exercise of political authority.

217. By what is authority bound?

All authority is bound by the **Natural Law**, which expresses the fundamental ethical values that are immediately evident to human reason. If any authority enacts laws and regulations that contradict these values, it creates an unjust "law" - in other words, a law that obliges no one. On account of the validity of the natural law, Nazi war criminals, for example, could not argue that they had merely acted according to the law and had obeyed the commands of a legitimate authority. Today these insights have been enshrined in international law.
