223. What does the Church say about the separation of powers and the constitutional State?

The Church has explicitly pronounced in favor of the principle of the separation of powers. Only when the Judicial, Legislative and Executive branches exit independently of one another is a constitutional State possible. This in turn is the prerequisite for the dignified development of human beings, for instance, inasmuch as they enjoy freedom of conscience and of religion. In particular, the existence of an independent judiciary is considered in Catholic social science ethics the test of an ethically justified political system. The principle of the constitutional State is regarded as something so fundamental that the Church makes herself subject to this principle: Catholic social teaching agrees that religious freedom, for instance, cannot be exclusively advantageous to the Catholic Church. Religious freedom must be guaranteed for all religious communities.

224. What connects and what separates Church and State?

Like the State, the Church on earth is a community with a visible organizational structure, yet they are mutually independent and self-governing. The Church is no longer politically bound up with the State, as was the case in the centuries of the "alliance of throne and altar". In this sense, the autonomy and independence of Church and State are especially emphasized. The political and the spiritual common good can be separated to a great extent, even though there will always be points of mutual contact. For this reason, Church and State must work together well. Despite the obligation to obey laws, the Church reserves the right to act as a moral corrective and to criticize the State when she sees ethical principles being violated.
