### **244. How are these values to become generally accepted in the international community?**

Generally acknowledged fundamental values and human rights must be the foundation for both the decisions and the communications of the international community. Building on them, members must formulate rules on which they can rely in their business and negotiations. Rules are needed when people want to negotiate something and reach a decision together. More than ever before, the rule that “might makes right” must be replaced at the international level by respect for the law.

### **245. Who needs this international community?**

Everyone. Yet countries are dependent on an international community to varying degrees. Highly developed countries need it more in order to be able to make economic agreements more securely or to gain access to raw materials and less in order to make a decent life possible for their populations. But that is precisely why developing countries need the international community. Ultimately all people have the same right to development and access to vitally essential goods ( food, clothing, education, etc.). All people also have a right to live in peace and freedom. Mutual support is therefore necessary. The necessity of an international community must not become a pretext for the creation of new dependencies and more complicated exploitative mechanisms between rich and poor countries.

### **246. With which organizations does the Church get along well?**

Since the 1940s the world has been determined to build an international community. In 1945 the United Nations was founded, and a few years later it issued the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Then in the early 1990s the World Trade Organization was formed. Many other organizations, which are more or less closely connected with the system of the United Nations, try to solve global problems ( Global Governance).
