

# Whatever you do to others...

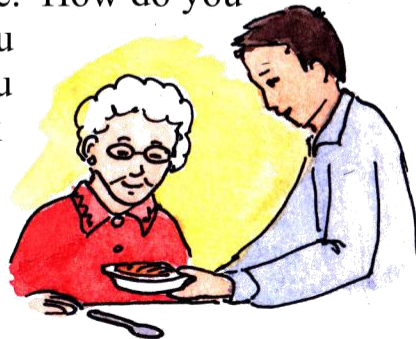



# Saint Catherine of Alexandria


## November 25


I baptize you in the Name of the Father...

WHEN SHE WOULDN'T AGREE WITH THE EMPEROR, HE THREW HER IN PRISON.


