


Meet and Greet June 18/19, 2022

- 4) Fr. Steven's birthday (June 19)




Corpus Christi Procession

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi (the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist) is on the weekend of June 18/19. After the 12 noon Mass, we will have an outdoor procession in the church parking lot. Right after the Procession, the Meet and Greet will take place in the hall.



Dispensation from Sunday Mass No longer in effect

On March 13, 2020, Cardinal Collins issued a dispensation from Sunday Mass due to the Covid restrictions. *Given that most of the health and safety restrictions in our parishes are no longer in place and the faithful are able to attend the celebration of the Eucharist once again, the basis for the dispensation from the Sunday obligation has dissipated and is no longer in effect.* As Catholics, we are obligated to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation Masses, but the Church does not obligate people to do the impossible. If individuals, based on their conscience, cannot attend Mass for a grave reason, including a great vulnerability to COVID-19 or because they are self-isolating to limit the spread of illness, then they are excused from their Sunday obligation, as the law of the Church allows.

We will be watching the sixth part of a mini series on the Life of St. Teresa of Avila, a great mystic and a Doctor of the Church. You will be inspired by her life of struggle, determination, and complete trust in God. 
Please note that the <u>Sunday 10:30 am Mass</u> will be regularly live-streamed.

Email Scams

These are fraudulent emails sent by criminals. Clergy and staff at the Archdiocese of Toronto and its parishes and missions do not solicit gifts by asking someone in an email to purchase gift cards. Do not reply to these emails, as an increased reply rate encourages more fake emails. If in doubt, contact sender by some alternate means such as <u>emailing or calling</u> the parish or chancery office associated with the sender.

June 12, 2022 - Wisdom Incarnate - By J. Luis Dizon Click here for today's Reading

Today is Trinity Sunday in the Liturgical Calendar. This day celebrates the doctrine of the Trinity, which is the central belief of the Christian faith on God's nature. It is defined as the belief that God is one *being*, yet three distinct *persons*. The *Catechism* describes the Trinity as follows:

The Trinity is One. We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons, the "consubstantial Trinity". The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire: "The Father is that which the Son is, the Son that which the Father is, the Father and the Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e. by nature one God." In the words of the Fourth Lateran Council (1215), "Each of the persons is that supreme reality, viz., the divine substance, essence or nature." (CCC 253)

If you are wondering how the passage from Proverbs came to be chosen as the first reading for this Sunday, one has to go back to the ancient debates about the person of Christ. Christian tradition has held that "Wisdom," as described in Proverbs, describes Christ before He became incarnate as a man. This idea goes back to St. Paul, who calls Christ *"the wisdom of God"* (<u>1</u> <u>Corinthians 1:24</u>).

However, this led to debates over whether or not Christ was created. Some translations state that the Lord "possessed" Wisdom at the beginning (e.g. DRB and ESV), while others translate it as "created" (e.g. RSV, NRSV and NJB) or "begot" (e.g. NABRE). This ambiguity arises because the Hebrew verb *qanah*, while it can be translated as *"to create,"* more often simply means "to possess," which does not necessitate Wisdom being created. The interpretation that this verb points to create." Orthodox interpreters of this passage usually reply by noting that the context of Proverbs 8:22-31 distinguishes Wisdom from the created order, rather than making Wisdom a part of it. They also argue that it is inconceivable that God would create Wisdom because this would mean that there was a time when God was without Wisdom. If this interpretation is accepted, then the eternality of Wisdom is preserved.

Thus, after much debate over this verse, it came to be recognized that it does not teach that Wisdom was created. This is further corroborated by <u>numerous passages of scripture</u> which teach that Jesus is fully God and consubstantial with the Father, just as is affirmed in the Nicene Creed.

This is important to remember in the face of many religions and sects that want to downplay this truth, either by saying Jesus was simply a prophet, or an archangel, or one of many deities – all of which are inadequate ways of understanding the person of Christ. Because of its centrality to the Faith, all Christians should take the time to understand the Trinity and learn how to both explain and defend it to others, as well as contemplate the implications of God's tri-unity in our own lives. We are enabled to have a relationship with our Heavenly Father, with His only Son, Jesus Christ, and with the Holy Spirit, who is always there to help us.
