October 30, 2022 - Kindness and Repentance - By J. Luis Dizon

## Click here for the Sunday Readings

In this passage, we are taught that the world and everything in it depends on the goodness of God. The whole world is nothing before the infinite God, yet He has deigned to show His mercy towards it. Scripture teaches us that all good things come from the Father above (James 1:17), and He is kind even to the ungrateful and evil (Luke 6:35)

God's purpose in showing this kindness is to move sinners to repent (v. 23). St. Paul echoes this teaching when he says that God's kindness is meant to move us to repentance (<u>Romans</u> <u>2:4</u>). He also does this to show that He loves everyone, even those who hate Him (v. 24).

This kindness manifests itself through His preservation of the world, which continues to exist only because He wills it to be so (vv. 25-26). This is also manifested in the rain and the sunshine that He bestows on the righteous and the wicked alike (cf. <u>Matthew 5:43-48</u>). The ultimate manifestation of this, of course, is the sending of Jesus to the world. As that famous passage from the Gospel of John goes:

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. (John 3:16-17)

We especially see how Jesus becomes a source of mercy and salvation in our Gospel reading about Zacchaeus (<u>Luke 19:1-10</u>). Despite his sinful past, Zacchaeus is welcomed by Jesus, and this welcome moves Zacchaeus to repent and become righteous. God does the same for us every time He provides us with good things that we don't deserve. This perfectly exemplifies the closing verse of the reading from Wisdom:

Therefore you correct little by little those who trespass, and remind and warn them of the things wherein they sin, that they may be freed from wickedness and put their trust in you, O Lord.
