Catechism Classes

What is FASTING?
The **limitation** of food and drink – typically to one main meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods in between. But remember to drink enough fluids!

When do we fast?
Ash Wednesday and Good Friday*

***Paschal Fast:** Good Friday and Holy Saturday are days of prayer and quiet reflection. We honour the suffering and death of Jesus and prepare to share in the joy of his resurrection at Easter.

What is ABSTINENCE?
Avoiding certain kinds of food or drink, typically meat or other desirable foods

When do we abstain?
Catholics are obliged to abstain from **meat every Friday** throughout the year (except solemn feast days)

TIP: Instead of abstaining, you may substitute special acts of charity or piety on Fridays

ALL ABOUT Fasting & Abstinence

Why fast?
It helps us to **pray better**: an empty stomach can lead to more attentive prayer

Who has to fast?
Catholics aged 18 to 59
Those with impaired health should not fast in any way.

Why abstain on Fridays?
It's **the day of Christ's saving death** on the cross; we abstain to share in His work of saving the world

Who has to abstain?
Catholics aged 14 and older

During *Lent*, the money we save on food while fasting and abstaining should be given to others in alms

Ash Wednesday is on February 22

Ash Wednesday, like Good Friday, is a day of Fasting and Abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence from meat is binding on those who are 14 and older. The law of fasting is binding on those who are 18 to 59 years of age. The requirement for fasting is that you can have one full meal and two other small meals in such a way that the two meals don't add up to a full meal (and of course, no meat). If required you may drink beverages between meals but not something that is very filling (such as milkshakes).

Mass times for *Ash Wednesday* are:

- **9:00 am,**
- **1:00 pm** St. Aidan School Mass (anyone can attend),
- **and 7:30 pm** (with Perpetual Help devotions).

Re: Turkey and Syria Earthquake - Humanitarian Relief

Two devastating earthquakes and hundreds of violent aftershocks in Turkey and Syria have caused great destruction in both countries. As search and rescue operations continue, the latest reports indicate that there are more than 40,000 people injured and the rising death toll has now surpassed 11,000 people.

The disaster began with a 7.8-magnitude earthquake early Monday morning, one of the strongest to hit the region in 100 years, toppled thousands of buildings throughout Turkey and Syria, creating even worse conditions for millions of Syrians already displaced by the ongoing civil war.

Freezing cold weather conditions are complicating rescue operations and adding further risk to survivors.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will accept donations and channel funds through Catholic partners (including Caritas Canada, Aid to the Church in Need, CNEWA, and Jesuits International) to support relief efforts underway.

February 12, 2023 - Choosing the Good (Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time) - By J. Luis Dizon

Although this week's missal reading from Sirach Chapter 15 only covers verses 15-20, it is worth reading **verses 11-14** as well, since they provide some important context for this reading. This passage of Sirach is important because it presents to us the view of free will that predominated ancient Judaism, and which informed the authors of the New Testament.

Both free will and predestination are taught in Scripture, but how to relate the two is a complicated matter, and different theologians have resolved the issues in different ways. Nevertheless, some definite boundaries are definitely established for us. On the one hand, the necessity of grace and our inability to believe or do any good apart from it is affirmed. For example, St. Paul tells us that faith is something that is granted to us by God (**Philippians 1:29**),

and that nobody can say that Jesus is Lord apart from the Holy Spirit (**1 Corinthians 12:3**). Jesus Himself says that nobody can come to Him unless the Father draws him (**John 6:44, 65**). The Church has condemned the idea that anyone can come to God unaided by grace, first in the *Council of Orange* (**529**), and then in the *Council of Trent* (**1547**). As those two councils teach:

If anyone maintains that some are able to come to the grace of baptism by mercy but others through free will, which has manifestly been corrupted in all those who have been born after the transgression of the first man, it is proof that he has no place in the true faith. For he denies that the free will of all men has been weakened through the sin of the first man, or at least holds that it has been affected in such a way that they have still the ability to seek the mystery of eternal salvation by themselves without the revelation of God. (***Council of Orange, canon 8***)

If any one saith, that the grace of God, through Jesus Christ, is given only for this, that man may be able more easily to live justly, and to merit eternal life, as if, by free will without grace, he were able to do both, though hardly indeed and with difficulty; let him be anathema. (***Council of Trent, Session VI, canon 2***)

On the other hand, the Scriptures also teach the necessity of one's free will to cooperate with God's grace. This reading from Sirach is a prime example of this. There are also numerous commands for us to choose the good, which are meaningful only if the one hearing them is able to do something about the command being given. For example:

I call heaven and earth to witness against you today, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Therefore choose life, that you and your offspring may live (**Deuteronomy 30:19**)

And if it is evil in your eyes to serve the Lord, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (**Joshua 24:15**)

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* affirms free-will when it says in the following paragraphs:

God's free initiative demands man's free response, for God has created man in his image by conferring on him, along with freedom, the power to know him and love him. the soul only enters freely into the communion of love. God immediately touches and directly moves the heart of man. He has placed in man a longing for truth and goodness that only he can satisfy. (**CCC 2002**)

The divine initiative in the work of grace precedes, prepares, and elicits the free response of man. Grace responds to the deepest yearnings of human freedom, calls freedom to cooperate with it, and perfects freedom. **(CCC 2022)**

Therefore, we affirm both the necessity of grace and the freedom of the will. Scripture and tradition teach both, and while it remains for cleverer minds to work out how the two harmonize with one another, we do not toss one or the other aside, or consider them to be contradictory.
