### All Saints and All Souls Day

Wednesday November 1 is the Feast of All Saints and Tuesday November 2 is All Souls Day. The Tradition for All Souls is that a priest is permitted to celebrate 3 Masses on that day. On Thursday November 2 we will have Mass at 9:00 am, 12 noon, and 7:30 pm.

#### Gaining of Indulgences for Month of November

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed any day during the days of November 1 to 8. Conditions for gaining an indulgence: Receive Holy Communion, go to confession during the period of 20 days before or after the indulgence act, pray one Our Father and one Hail Mary for the Holy Father's intentions, be free from attachment to sin, including venial sin. A full or plenary indulgence does away with all the temporal punishment due to sin. If the conditions are not fully met only a partial indulgence is gained.
