Holy Days of Obligation

Catholics are required to attend Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. In Canada there are only two Holy Days of Obligation that do not usually fall on a Sunday; Christmas and New Year's Day. Please note that this Christmas season, December 25 and January 1 fall on a Monday. You must attend a Christmas Mass and the preceding Sunday Mass. For New Year's you must attend a New Year's Mass and the preceding Sunday Mass. You must attend two obligation Masses each weekend, from the Saturday to the Monday.

Hats in Church

Now that the weather is getting colder, it makes sense to cover our heads when we are outside. Please note that when indoors, males should not wear a hat. More specifically when in church, men are not permitted to wear hats. Females can wear hats in church and are actually encouraged to cover or veil their hair according to 1 Corinthians 11. A dispensation has been granted by the Church allowing women to have their hair uncovered. So, females can cover their hair by wearing hats or veils, but males must not cover their heads. This is not just a long standing custom for all indoor places but when in church, it is one of the ways in which we show respect to our Eucharistic Lord, truly present in the Tabernacle.
