New Year's Message from Fr. Steven 2024

On New Year's Day we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. This feast reminds us of, and points to, the real meaning of Christmas; that the Christ Child who was born for us is God, the Second Person of the Trinity who assumed human nature and became one of us. The year 2024 also reminds us that it was 2,024 years ago that Christ was born into this world. Celebrating Christ's birth is a reminder to us of all the good Christ came to accomplish, and of all the darkness, suffering and evil He came to overthrow and conquer. Epiphany Blessing

The Solemnity of the Epiphany is traditionally on January 6 but is now celebrated on the Sunday that falls closest to it. This 2024 it falls on Sunday January 7th. There is a tradition that on the feast of Epiphany, the head of each household would lead his/ her family in prayer and blessing of their home. The parish priest cannot bless everyone's home and so the head of the family would do this every year. After doing the blessing, he would sprinkle holy water about the house and use blessed chalk to mark the main entrance lintel of their home with the following: 20+C+M+B+24 (the number would change every year; to indicate the year we are in). The letters stand for the three Magi or Wisemen: Caspar, Melchoir and Balthasar. They also represent the Latin blessing: Christus mansionem benedicat, which means "May Christ bless this house". Fr. Steven will try to have blessed chalk available on the feast of Epiphany for everyone to bless their homes. All you need is a small container to get some holy water.

Holy Water

Catholics are encourage to use holy water in their homes. Water is a natural symbol of purification and life. Water has been blessed is efficacious in warding off evil spirits, preserving us from sin, even sickness. Holy water is also a good source of obtaining more of God's blessings and graces. You are welcome to take water from our holy water font. You will need to bring your own small bottle or container. The holy water dispenser is on the left side of the church, close to the pieta statue.
