- 3. Commune Examine your conscience. Go to confession if you need to. Try to connect with Jesus in the Tabernacle.
- 4. Do not speak with your neighbour unnecessarily. The church is a place of prayer.
- 5. Dress properly this is to show decency and honour to God.
- 6. No phones Turn your mobile phones off.
- 7. Genuflect Bring your right knee to the ground, facing the Tabernacle, before entering your pew.
- 8. Participate Sing, respond, listen, and pray.
- 9. Think of others Respect the pew and the queue.
- 10. Be still Don't be in a hurry. Enjoy and feel God's presence and thank Him for His blessings and graces.

## **Bowing or Looking Up?**

During the consecration of the Body and Blood of Christ, when the priest elevates the Host and afterwards the chalice, some people bow others look up. Which is correct? The correct action is to look up at the Host and at the Chalice. During these elevations, the bells are rung, to remind us to look up (if for some reason we may have been distracted). We are called to adore Our Eucharistic Lord, Who has just become present to us under the appearance of bread and wine. The priest is instructed "to show" the consecrated bread and wine to the people. The same is true just before Communion. The priest says, "behold the Lamb of God..." These are times we should be looking at (beholding), and adoring, and communing with Our Eucharistic Lord.
