Feast of St. Aidan

The Feast of St. Aidan normally falls on August 31. He was born in Ireland around the year 590, and died on August 31, 651. He lived as a monk from a relatively young age at the ancient monastery on the Island of Iona. He was sent to re-evangelize Northumbria, present day northern England and southeastern Scotland. He was one to traverse both town and country on foot, never on horseback, unless compelled by some urgent necessity; and wherever in his way he saw any, either rich or poor, he invited them to embrace the mystery of the faith or if they were believers, to strengthen them in the faith, and to stir them up by words and actions to alms and good works. He was responsible for the construction of churches, monasteries and schools throughout Northumbria. At the same time, he earned a tremendous reputation for his pious charity and dedication to the less fortunate - such as his tendency to provide room, board and education to orphans, and his use of contributions to pay to free slaves. St. Aidan, pray for us.
