ShareLife Sunday

Today is our third weekend of special collection for ShareLife Sunday. Reverence for life at all stages has been a core principle of ShareLife since its founding in 1976. Corpus Christi Procession

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ takes place on the weekend of June 6/7. After our 12 noon Mass on Sunday June 7 we will have an outdoor procession around the Church and School with the Blessed Sacrament, while praying the Rosary. Everyone is invited to participate.

Sunday Mass Time Preference

We have the results of the preference of parishioners to the proposed time changes for Sunday Masses. The overwhelming majority of parishioners preferred the 8:30 am, 10:30 am, 12:30 pm option. Once we have the bishop's approval, we will implement these changes starting on Sunday July 5. Note that these changes will be permanent and not just for the summer months. The new Mass schedule will begin on Sunday July 5th.

Thanks to our Catholic Women's League and the Knights of Columbus our next Movie Night will be on Sat. June 6, right after the 5:00 pm Mass, starting at 6:15.
